



LATIN CURRICULUM OVERVIEW

Year 7 and Year 8

As students embark on developing their comprehension of the Latin language for reading purposes and understanding of the history and culture of Roman civilisation they become engaged in a learning process that will address and activate a wide range of highly useful and relevant skills.

Students begin learning about nominative, accusative and dative cases, singular and plural, of 1st, 2nd and 3rd declension nouns. Present, imperfect and perfect tenses, all persons, of 1st, 2nd and 3rd and 4th conjugation verbs.

Book 2 – Year 9

At the last year of Latin, students continue to apply acquired knowledge and skills as they address more complex language and grammar contents and advance in their cultural and historical enrichment. The history lessons in the course of Book 2 become even more palpable and relevant for students as they turn to their own geographical vicinity and explore the legacy of Roman Britain.
